The mission of The Women's Home (TWH), empowering women in crisis to be productive, selfsufficient individuals, correlates well with Zonta's mission. TWH is a nationally recognized model of excellence and clients par-

ticipate in comprehensive clinical, vocational and chemical dependency programs.

TWH Vocational Classes

Zonta is completing the last of the current series of vocational classes on Friday April 21st. As a reminder, the participants must complete the Zonta classes before they can begin job search.

Chelsey Gutierrez, TWH Manager Support Services, has surveyed the current class participants anonymously for feedback on the class content and benefit. The favorite

classes were resume writing where they learned about their strengths, resume preparation and computer skills along with mock interviewing. There wasn't anything that they would change about the sessions and thought they were effective. One participant wished they had more interviewing practice and another more time to build her resume.

On a scale of 1 to 10 on how prepared they felt for job search, respondents rated between 7 and 10. Other comments: "I'm thankful for the Zonta Experience."

Thank you to the volunteers who have given up their Friday afternoons from 1:15-3:15pm to present the nine classes and share their experience and knowledge. There is nothing more rewarding than later running into the ladies and having them tell you about their new job and how much they appreciate the Zontians and the Zonta classes.

As we wrap up the current series, there are another 11 participants ready to begin the next series of Zonta vocational classes. (cont. on page 4)

Chelsey Gutierrez has asked Zonta to consider offering fast-track sessions in addition to the existing sessions. These would be compressed sessions offered to clients who have had recent careers, but require assistance with managing change, resumes, interviewing skills and using social media for job search. It would be a small group of clients who require fast-tracking back into the job market. Current thought is that the fast-track sessions would consist of two to four hour sessions in addition to our basic nine session series. This is very aggressive and totally dependent upon Zonta resources being available. A very tentative schedule is below which will be discussed at the April 19th meeting. Collateral Repair Project Selected as Recipient of Fundraising

Amanda Lane, the Executive Director of Collateral Repair Project (CRP), a grassroots organization supporting refugees in Amman, Jordan, spoke at Zonta Club of Houston's October 2016 meeting. On April 1, the Federation of American Women's Clubs Overseas (FAWCO) announced at their annual conference that a CRP project involving education of female refugees has been selected as FAWCO's Target Project for targeted fundraising over the next two years (goal of \$125,000-150,000). CRP's application was submitted by Zonta member and CRP board member, Therese Hartwell.

UAHT Receives Grant from UNICEF



United Against Human Trafficking has received a grant from UNICEF to focus on educating the public, training professionals and empowering the community to take action for the purpose of identifying, recovering and restoring trafficking victims' freedom through in-person facilitated

training programs. The grant will support existing programs in the Houston and surrounding areas. UNICEF

has been a member of UAHT's Houston Rescue & Restore Coalition since 2012. The grant is part of UNICEF'S comprehensive approach to joining the fight in ending child trafficking not just on a global scale, but domestically, as well.

"We are overjoyed, as an organization, to receive such an amazing donation, and look forward to this continued partnership. We could not be more excited about this opportunity," said Chris Flanagan, Director of Development for United Against Human Trafficking.

ZONTA INTERNATIONAL NEWS

Zonta International Supports UNFPA (United Nations Population Fund)

This month the United States, one of UNFPA's founding members, made the decision to deny any future funding for UNFPA's life saving work, a decision that will ultimately have devastating consequences for women and girls worldwide. Zonta International President Sonja Honig Schough and Past International President and International Advocacy Chairman Maria Jose Landeira Oestergaard issued a statement on April 8th in response to the decision by the US. A portion of this statement is reproduced below.

"Zonta International is dismayed to learn of the United States' decision to withdraw funding for the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), a decision that will ultimately have devastating consequences for women and girls worldwide.

For more than 10 years, Zonta International has proudly partnered with UNFPA to deliver critical life-changing and life-saving programs for the most vulnerable women and girls, improving health, eradicating violence against women and ending all forms of harmful practices.

In Liberia Zonta International has partnered with UNFPA to treat and prevent obstetric fistula by providing surgical treatment for women and girls living with this condition and reintegrating them back into their communities, equipped with the

knowledge and skills to lead full and productive lives. Fistula is a devastating but preventable childbirth injury usually caused by prolonged, obstructed labor without timely medical intervention... women suffering from fistula are stigmatized and abandoned by their families and by their communities.

In Niger, Zonta International has partnered with UNFPA to reduce child marriage, and to help adolescent girls in Niger develop their health, social and economic assets, know their rights and be in a strong position to defend them and be safer and have protection against violence. Child marriage is a form of sexual and gender-based violence with harmful physical, social and economic effects including the detrimental impact in the societies of early pregnancies. ...

These programs are examples of UNFPA's work in making a difference for thousands of women and girls worldwide. Today UNPFA works in more than 150 countries and territories covering more than 80 percent of the world's population. Thanks to partnerships with organizations like Zonta International and the critical support of governments, UNFPA was able in 2016 to save the lives of more than 2,300 women from dying during pregnancy and childbirth and to ensure more than 1,250 fistula surgeries, among many other achievements.

Today and every day, Zonta International stands in support of UNFPA and its work to promote and protect the rights of women and girls worldwide.
